
Japanese Macaque

(*Macaca fuscata*)



Status: Least Concern

Threats: Loss of forests and hunting by humans

What country does it live in? Japan, Asia

Where does it live? In forests. It is the most Northern of any primate (excluding humans)



How long do they live? 33 years

What do they eat? Fruit, seeds, leaves, bark, fungi, bird eggs, animals e.g. crayfish

How big are they? Same as a beagle. Males are generally larger

How do they talk? Coo to keep in contact, squeal to say that another is in charge. Alarm calls that are different for different predators

Who do they live with? Many males & females. More females. Females have a very strong rank, babies have their mother's rank, males less strong rank. Very friendly

How do they walk? Walks on all fours

What do they do? Good swimmers. They take hot thermal baths in winter

Where would you find it? In the day on the ground and in the trees
